Lessons Taught By Thieves by Jack Thompson – 11/10/1974

INTRODUCTION

- 1. Lk. 23:33-I3
- 2. The central act in the history of humanity is the crucifixion and resurrection of Christ Jesus
- 3. Many important lessons around the cross.
- 4. But, what about the thieves: Are there any lessons we might learn from them???

BODY

- 1. THEY TEACH THE NECESSITY OF SORROW FOR SIN AND REPENTANCE:
 - A. 2nd thief quick to state they were receiving what they deserved. (Vs. 44)
 - B. Man must realizes his sinful condition requires the cleansing blood of Christ.
 - C. Until heart is convicted of sin, TRANSGRESSION OF GOD'S LAW, it will never be humbled to OBEY.
 - 1. 1st thief Shows most are not willing to make this admission, ONE REVILED THE LORD, <u>SAVE US</u>
 - 2. MANY TODAY HAVE THIS ATTITUDE:
 - a. "Why doesn't God do something about my problem?
 - b. Many base their faith on "What has Jehovah done for me lately?"
 - c. Unless God pays their bills, solves all their problems NO HUMILITY ON THEIR PART.
 - D. Yet, the penitent thief saw himself for what he was just punishment for his deeds.
 - E. Rom. 6:23 Wages of sin is death.
- 2. THEY TEACH THE RESPONSIBILITY OF MAN IN THE EXERCISE O F FREE WILL:
 - A. No one can make us believe. Cannot force us to determine what we will do about salvation.
 - B. Each thief had same opportunity to confess Christ.
 - C. Only one did, Why?? Because we are free moral agents
 - D. YOU HAVE ABILITY TO CHOOSE INTELLECT TO KNOW...
 - 1. Some teach lon Spirit as a force that directly Influences men to obey, accent Christ
 - 2. Some say God sends dreams, visions, still small voices to move individuals to salvation.
 - 3. THESE DESTROY THE FREE WILL OF MAN,
 - E. God sent His Son Word Written ALL HAVE SAME OPPORTUNITY AND RE-SPONSIBILITY.
 - 1. Dreams, visions, etc. God would be a respecter of persons for the one who did not see or feel.
 - F. Both thieves looked at same evidence. One was moved, the other not.
 - 1. We must examine the evidence today WORD OF GOD
 - a. Some will accept, obey; some will not How sad!!

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- b. Jn. 20:30 Examine His Credentials.
- 3. THEY TEACH THE SOVEREIGN POWER OF CHRIST:
 - A. Christ was still living at this point.
 - B. His testament was not yet in effect. Heb 9:16
 - C. By His sovereign power He made a place for the thief
 - D. By His sovereign power He has made a place for you and me.
 - E. Then a special degree; BUT the same authority has given a plan of salvation for all me to
 - F. We would not want to rob Him of his power to act then, nor would we want to deny Him the RIGHT TO DETERMINE WHAT MAN MUST DO TO OBEY NOW.
 - G. When His will, testament, became effective at His death, then it became law for all men to follow CANNOT EXPECT EXCEPTION.
- 4. THEY TEACH THE LESSON THAT WE MUST STAND OUT FROM THE CROWD:
 - A. I. Death-bead salvation? Is that the lesson of the penitent thief?
 - B. 2. Consider the circumstances (His example hard to follow): He professed faith when seemingly no OTHER VOICE was willing to so do.
 - 1. Disciples not ready for such a confession.
 - 2. Peter denied Him, Judas betrayed Him.
 - 3. World crying "Dome down if you are the Son of God.
 - 4. YET: This man confessed faith in Him.
 - a. Note: Mt. 27:42 Do what we want and we will obey.
 - C. Is this the kind of man to put off confession until the time of death?
 - 1. The faith which will act when opportunity us presented to respond.
 - D. NO NOT DEATH-BED REPENTANCE. A response when this man was convinced of Sonship of Christ.

CONCLUSION

- 1. Some desire to use the thief as a pattern of salvation since, they claim, he was not baptized. (Would be difficult to prove.)
- 2. He lived and died before Christ's will became effective (Heb. 9:16)
- 3. NOW CHRIST'S WILL IS LAW WHAT DOES IT REQUIRE???
 - A. God's plan to save. Sovereign power of Christ.
